Introduction

This statement sets out Smart's actions to understand all potential modern slavery risks related to its business and to put in place steps that are aimed at ensuring that there is no slavery or human trafficking in its own business and its supply chains. This statement relates to actions and activities during the financial year 2020.

Organisation Structure & Supply Chain

Smart is the UK's leading supplier of aluminium glazing systems and bespoke aluminium extrusions.

Our products and systems are proven in a wide range of new-build and refurbishment projects throughout the UK, spanning the complete range of architectural, commercial, public, new-build and retail applications.

Smart is incorporated in the UK through Smart Systems Limited and Smart Aluminium Extrusions Limited. Based in Yatton, North Somerset, employing over 500 people, we have an annual turnover in excess of £100 million. Our key supply chain involves aluminium which can be sourced globally.

Policy

Smart's employees are bound by a Code of Conduct demonstrating that Smart strives to maintain the highest standards of employee conduct and ethical behaviour when operating and managing its supply chain.
